FLINT WOMEN'S FORUM ANNOUNCES SPEAKER FOR 2015 CELEBRATION OF WOMEN EVENT

Flint, MI – As The Flint Women's Forum (FWF) celebrates its 35th anniversary, it is pleased to announce its speaker for the 2015 annual Celebration of Women will be Colonel Kriste Kibbey Etue, Director of the Michigan State Police, the first woman to be elected to the position. This year's event is being held on April 24, 2015 at The Flint Golf Club.

Col. Kriste Kibbey Etue was appointed Director of the Michigan State Police in January 2011 by Governor Rick Snyder. Colonel Etue is the 18th Director in the 97-year history of the department and the department's first female Director. During her 27-year tenure with the Michigan State Police, Colonel Etue has held several executive positions focusing on emergency management and homeland security, budgeting, facility management, training, human resources, and public affairs. Today, Colonel Etue serves as State Director of Emergency Management and Homeland Security. She also chairs the Michigan Homeland Protection Board, Michigan Public Safety Communications Interoperability Board, Auto Theft Prevention Authority, and Michigan Intelligence Operations Center Advisory Board.
